2021 - 2022 School Improvement Plan Update

- **Reading**
 - We are currently short 2 intervention paras, 2 special education paras, and 3 kindergarten paras. Council members asked if High School students could work as tutors to help out. Jenny will check on this but it still will not solve our shortage in employees. Council members were asked to spread the word about our openings. Council members asked how they could help. It was suggested they attend the District Board Meeting to give input.
 - Mrs. Anderson has started working afternoons to provide another level of intervention.
 - DIBELS MOY GROWTH (The state goal is 60% and the district goal is 75%.)
 - We tested a month early this year.
 - Our scores are lower than we would like. We are hoping the end of year testing will be better. (See test results for Middle of year (MOY) on attached paper.) Testing is done by Para's—different people. The State of Utah put the tests together. We cannot change them. We need more help – paid aides – we will train them.
- **Parent Engagement**
 - SEPs had better attendance than PIE night
 - PIE night in February will be structured differently. Council Members were hesitant to have another PIE night. The first PIE night was way too long and not as informative as they would have liked. The PIE night in February will be more like an SEP setting. Data of where a student is in comparison to others in the class will be shared with parents (no names of other students will be shared). This will be done on a shorter time line and the teachers will put it together.
 - Continue to provide resources for parents

- **Math**
 - Acadience Math Scores (Percent on or above benchmark)
 - This is a new assessment this year.
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- **Positive Student Behavior**
 - Schoolwide management plan
 - Skills Room and Behavior Tech
 - Wellness Room, Second Step Program, Counseling Services

Next Steps:

- RTI is going well, keep it going
- Renewed focus on small reading group instruction
 - Professional development, modeling, learning walks (Heather Kunde is putting this together for teachers.)
- Decodable books for small group instruction and the take home library
- Make math RTI more strategic using the benchmark data

Attendance: Dallas Dixon talked about the attendance issues we are having. We are above the district average for absences in all grade levels. We have a high number of students missing each day and only $\frac{1}{3}$ are excused by parents. With the COVID protocol there are not really any repercussions for parents. Suggestions were to ask teachers to reach out to parents when a student is gone a lot. Maybe put homework missed by a student in their cubby for them to do upon returning to school. Encourage kids to take responsibility to email teachers asking for their homework when absent. Give the attendance letter to the student as well as the parent.
